



UNCOVER NORTH EAST was a call to all music lovers to come and experience the beautiful Eastern Himalayan town of Ziro and enjoy the Ziro Festival of Music, all while riding the Royal Enfield Meteor 350. The ride flagged off in Guwahati and traversed through some incredibly picturesque locations in Assam and Arunachal Pradesh, with the ground 'Ziro' being an audiophile's paradise for three days.



Key Places of Uncover North East:

Guwahati: Often referred to as the Gateway to North East India, Guwahati is the largest metropolis in the region. As you fly into the city, the Brahmaputra River welcomes you with a majestic view. Guwahati is a vibrant cultural hub, home to iconic landmarks such as the Kamakhya Temple, bustling markets, wildlife sanctuaries, and much more.

















Ziro: Nestled in the Eastern Himalayas, 1500 meters above sea level, lies the small town of Ziro, famous for its natural beauty and lush green hills. It is the cultural heritage site of the Apatani tribe and also the home to the famous Ziro Festival of Music.





Ziro Festival, founded in 2012, is a celebration of passion, sustainability, community, and cultural diversity. The festival promotes indigenous tribes and artists from Northeast India and from around the globe. Hosted in the picturesque Ziro Valley in Arunachal Pradesh, the festival prioritises sustainability by using locally-sourced materials like bamboo and employs local community members to host attendees. The festival's skills training programmes have empowered community members by actively involving them in producing the festival and employing local artisans to build the bamboo infrastructure. The festival engages artists, artisans, and local youth groups through community outreach programmes.


























































EAST COAST CRUISE
































A ride to the Kumbhalgarh fort, also known as the Great Wall of India, along with the immersive experience of Rajasthan's vibrant culture and regional cuisine.



















